ABOUT ST ANDREW'S DAY

Saint Andrew's Day is also known as the Feast of Saint Andrew.

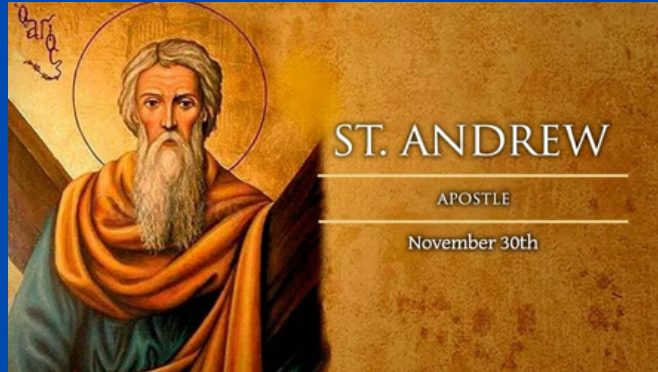
The Scottish celebration of the apostle Saint Andrew as a national festival is thought to have originated from the reign of Malcolm III(1058-1093).

Why is Saint Andrew so important to Scotland?

Having Saint Andrew as Scotland's patron saint gave the country several advantages: because he was the brother of Saint Peter, founder of the Church, the Scots were able to appeal to the Pope in 1320 for protection against the attempts of English kings to conquer the Scots.

In 2006 the Scottish government made 30th November a holiday to honour the patron saint who symbolises Scottish history and culture. Saint Andrew's Day is celebrated on the 30th as this is apparently the date that Saint Andrew was crucified by the Romans in 60AD

Saint Andrew's Day is now one of the most important dates in the Scottish calendar after Burns Night and Hogmanay
